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Lifesaving

There has been a lot of activity on our beach with rescues and shark alarms. It is important that when this is happening that everyone remains calm. It can be daunting being in the water when all the alarms are going off, especially for our Nippers. It's important to get out of the water safely and calmly. When a rescue is occurring, please remain calm and allow our lifesavers to do what they have been trained to do. Our patrol members are always watching the beach and the water and have direct contact with the Inflatable Rescue Boat when needed.

Mental Health Awareness training

SLSWA is orgainising Peer Support Training for members of surf lifesaving clubs. This is a 4 hour, in-person course which is designed to provide Peer Supporters with education, information, and practice to assist members maintain positive mental health, and how to work alongside persons involved in traumatic events and critical incidents.

The training will also include practice in informal counselling skills, how / when to seek professional help, and the importance of self-care.

The establishment of courses will be determined by demand. Courses run with a minimum of six attendees.

Nipper Rescue Course - 8 December 2024

Nipper Rescue Course (NRC) for all new members who would like to help with water safety for their child's age group. This is an approx. 4h course with part theory and part swim/rescue. Please email <u>vicepresident@portbouvardslsc.com.au</u> for more info or speak to your child's Age Manager. Please note you must register your interest as we need a minimum of four to do the course. If your child's group does not have enough water safety, they will not be able to get out into the water as much, we have a strict ratio of 1 to 5.

This is a fun session for Nippers. We start with about an hour of Nippers, followed by a visit from Santa - wonder how he will arrive this time?! I love that the kids at nippers learn important surf lifesaving skills, first aid, general beach safety and keep fit! Being an age manager has helped me to also learn all of these things and yes, it helps with the fitness as well! It has been such a privilege looking after the now under 12's on the beach for the last 6 years, seeing them all grow up, develop amazing skills and confidence and getting to know their parents and grandparents.

U13's Ginny and Mark Price - the husband and wife team

We've been involved with nippers for the past 9 years. As soon as we arrived in Australia we signed our eldest child up to nippers, even though it was mid season, we understood the importance of being surf aware in our new country of residence - in the UK we lived in the countryside and we really knew nothing about beach safety like rips or what to do if you got bitten by a snake. Looking back it was one of the best decisions we made as not only did it educate us and our children, we gained a huge surf club family in the process. We did put our hands up and threw ourselves into the mix - Mark did water safety and I started off as parent help on the beach in my eldest son's group and things snowballed from there.

When my youngest Ethan started in u6s he just loved it and by the time we got to U8's he was raring to go to the competitions up in Perth. So not only did Luise and I share age manager - I became a technical official along with a couple of other parents so that the club could compete as we have to provide officials at the competitions and carnivals. Over the years we have had some great weekends away where memories and friendships have blossomed and the kids have come away with some bling in the form of medals. There's nothing that makes me more proud than when my U10 girls absolutely stunned the Perth clubs and took out the running relay silver medal and when they were on the podium being interviewed they gave a thankyou to me. More recently we haven't been able to field teams so have had to join other clubs- but the kids have had a ball -it's not all about the winning, it's about taking part.

I love educating the kids about first aid and rescues - making sure they know how to be safe doing a rescue is so important. When my eldest was 12 he was awarded the WA Surf Lifesaving Bronze Medallion for Bravery, for rescuing a child that had fallen into the canals in Wannanup. He learnt this and had the confidence to do it, from nippers. I really like to install into the kids it's not all about being competitive, it's about learning life skills that could help you in a sticky situation! There's also nothing more rewarding than nurturing the kids who aren't that confident in the water - helping them overcome their fears and watching them swim around the cans, navigate a board through a wave and getting them to believe and achieve something they thought they were not capable of.

Even if you are not strong or confident in the ocean - like me (if anyone sees me in the ocean you know it's a seriously calm day) - there are plenty of other ways to support and help run the club. Whether it be a first aid person drone operator, administrator role, witch or pirate - every little bit helps and to be honest, the more you give to the club the more rewarding it is. We are quite sad that's its our last year age managing - I'm pretty sure we will still help out the beautiful Port Bouvard surf club family - it's become part of our life and I hope it becomes part of yours too!
